Position: Summer Camp Teacher Naturalist

Location: Billings, MT

Employment Period: June 14 – August 13

- Full-day training on June 14, 15, and 16
- Two full days of lesson plan prep on June 17 and 18
- Camps from 7:30 AM – 1:30 PM during the weeks of June 21 – 25, July 5 – 9, July 12 – 16, July 26 – 30, August 2 – 6, and August 9 – 13.

Job Description:

Teach outdoor, hands-on activities during summer camps for children ages 5 – 13. Each week of camp is geared to a specific age group and theme. Teacher Naturalist will develop lesson plans with a senior staff member. Activities may include bird walks, canoeing, insect collecting, kite-making, and orienteering. Daily de-brief and planning sessions will follow each morning of camp.

Qualifications:

Applicants should

1. be comfortable working with children ages 5 – 13 years old.
2. have exceptional interpersonal and academic skills.
3. be self-motivated, able to follow directions, and work independently.
4. have a demonstrated interest in natural resources, environmental and natural sciences, education and/or recreation.
5. be comfortable working outdoors for extended periods of time.
